1830	in no.22 road gang stationed at Longbottom
1832	assigned to the AA Company at Port Stephens, there until 1837
Aug 1837	ticket-of-leave for the Port Macquarie district
Jan 1839	ticket altered to Invermein (Scone) district
Jun 1840	working for John Eales at Liverpool Plains for 12 months
Mar 1841	died in Newcastle General Hospital, occupation given as shepherd
