T.O.L.	37/1890, 18 December 1837, 4/4116 (reel 928), Invermein district 41/983, 27 April 1841, 4/4150 (reel 940), Scone district, altered to Murrurundi 20 June 1843. Issued in lieu of 37/1890 returned mutilated and cancelled. TOLPPT 40/85, 4 March 1840, 4/4239 (reel 967). Allowed to proceed to Liverpool Plains in the service of Mr John Eales. TOLPPT 41/197, 3 May 1841, 4/4242 (reel 968). Allowed to proceed to Liverpool Plains in the service of Mr John Eales for 12 months.
